Leon Kirchner is one of the most individual voices in American composition. His powerful, expressive music carries on the legacy of his teachers Arnold Schoenberg, Ernest Bloch, and Roger Sessions. Kirchner heightens the experience with colorful directions in his scores, such as 'Haltingly', 'Wild', and 'Coming from nowhere, almost out of control.'
