



Orthodox in its four movement structure, but 'unorthodox inside', Havergal Brian's Second Symphony composed in 1930 - 31, was originally inspired by Goethe's play *Götz von Berlichingen*. In 1972, however, Brian's beloved daughter died, and the 96-year-old composer dedicated his forty-year-old symphony to her memory. Its meaning for him by then was 'Man in his Cosmic Loneliness'.
