

Schubert's prolific output during the thirty-one years of his life included fifteen string quartets, as well as the hundreds of songs on which his reputation as the father of German *lieder* is based. This volume spans much of Schubert's short career. The last quartet, No. 15, written towards the end of Schubert's life when his health was in decline, is a melancholic outpouring, at times elegiac, at others punctuated by bold, dramatic harmonies. In contrast, the *German Dances*, written when he was sixteen, retain a joyful simplicity and the flavour of a *Schubertiade* (a musical gathering of Schubert's friends).
