

Although John Ireland is best remembered for his orchestral works, his 91 songs convey a peculiarly English quality of emotion expressed through reserve. The many gems on this recording include the bitter-sweet *Sea Fever* (1913), with its yearning strophic melody sailing on an accompaniment that is varied with each verse, the dark, fatalistic *Three Songs to Poems by Thomas Hardy* and the heart-rending *Her Song*, one of Ireland's most beautiful. Ireland's failure to find love is perhaps best expressed in the bleak cycle *Two Poems of A.E. Housman*.
