

A close contemporary of Weber, the German-born Friedrich Kuhlau settled in Copenhagen, where he spent the greater part of his career as a composer, pianist and teacher. Kuhlau wrote a copious quantity of music for the piano, including a fine *Piano Concerto* reminiscent of early Beethoven, salon music and other works of varied technical difficulty. The *Sonatinas* and *Sonatas* 'non difficiles' featured on this disc were of practical use in teaching or for domestic music-making.
