"Extraordinary memory, brilliant technique and unusually insightful performances – these are the features of Idil Biret's music making which allow her to play works inaccessible to other pianists, even eminent ones. The range of her repertoire is truly astounding. In the 1980s she performed, for example, Beethoven's 32 Sonatas and 9 Symphonies in the Liszt transcriptions. In 1997, during the centenary of Brahms' death, she performed all his solo piano works in Germany. Her repertoire includes over one hundred concertos. In her playing Idil Biret reaches the levels of her great masters Kempff and Cortot."
