

The great Polish composer Witold Lutosławski was an important conductor of his own highly expressive music. With *Chain 1* he developed a new compositional method linking contrasting musical ideas into a satisfying whole. *Partita*, *Interlude* and *Chain 2* form an impressive trilogy. *Chantefleurs et Chanfables* is a luminous, bittersweet song cycle. Canadian soprano Valdine Anderson has been acclaimed for performances ranging from Baroque to contemporary music. Fujiko Imajishi, concertmaster of the National Ballet of Canada and Esprit Orchestra, has enjoyed a long association with Toronto's New Music Concerts.


