A series of powerful, largely radical works in the early 1920s saw Hindemith established as Germany's leading young composer. In 1936 he was asked by choreographer and dancer Léonide Massine to collaborate on a ballet project, and Hindemith proposed scenes from the life of St Francis of Assisi. The resulting ballet, *Nobilissima Visione* (The Noblest Vision), is a work of lyricism, elegy and majesty. The *Five Pieces for String Orchestra* is an earlier, spirited work dating from 1927.
