AMERICAN OPERA CLASSICS

Born in Nebraska, of Scandinavian heritage, Howard Hanson was influenced as much by Jean Sibelius as by his American surroundings. The plot of his 1933 opera, *Merry Mount*, set in New England in 1625 during a conflict between the Puritans and the Cavaliers, is anything but merry. However, the composer described the music as "warm-blooded...essentially a lyrical work [that] makes use of broad melodic lines as often as possible". Listeners familiar with Hanson's first two symphonies will find strong melodic and harmonic affinities with *Merry Mount*. This recording derives from a critically acclaimed pair of concert performances by Seattle Symphony and Gerard Schwarz in October 1996. Hanson's *Symphony No. 1* can be heard on Naxos 8.559072.
