

Lightning Slingers and Dead Ringers (2008)

For piano and sampling keyboard

1. With enthusiasm and a little violence

2. Languid and layered

3. Machine-like, but with some groove

A "Lightning Slinger" is a telegraph operator, an apt simile for a pianist who translates musical ideas into an electric medium. This piece is performed on a piano and a keyboard sampler simultaneously, so that the pianist can use her great piano technique and interpretive skills in both the acoustic and electronic realms.

4. Brooklyn, October 5, 1941 (1997)

For piano with baseballs and catcher's mitt

Inspired by the 1941 Dodgers vs. Yankees world series, this piece is performed with two baseballs and a catcher's mitt. The baseballs are rolled, rubbed and struck on the keys, strings, and soundboard of the piano, and the mitt provides an expanded span for giant clusters and chords.
