This 1954 recording of Mahler's Symphony No. 9 was re-released on Vox/Turnabout in 1970. About that re-issue *Gramophone*, in its March 1971 review, had the following to say: "Vox issued the first LP of (this) work in 1954, with Horenstein conducting the Vienna Symphony Orchestra: at last one could sit down and absorb Mahler's Ninth at leisure, without interruption... Horenstein's performance sounded magnificent then,
