The French-born **Florent Schmitt** was well known as a critic and composer during his lifetime, but his compositions fell into neglect after his death. He studied at the Paris Conservatoire and won the Prix de Rome in 1900. Writing in a dramatic and luxuriant style that also acknowledged the influence of impressionism, he won a seat in the Institut de France in 1936 and remained active until his death at the age of eighty-seven. The ballet *La Tragédie de Salomé* is perhaps his best-known work.
