One of the great war novels, *The Red Badge of Courage* describes the first experience of front-line combat through the eyes of a young recruit, Henry Fleming, in one of the battles of the American Civil War. Under the stress of battle, Fleming is forced to face strong, conflicting emotions, ranging from bravado to terror, as the conflict ebbs and flows. Written some thirty years after the War, when Stephen Crane was still only in his mid-twenties, its inimitable truth makes it just as relevant now. A powerful, but very human account.



Walter Lewis graduated from Washington University in his home town of St Louis, Missouri and then moved to England to train at the London Studio Centre. He has worked in TV, film and theatre on both sides of the Atlantic. He has recorded many dramas for BBC Radio, including *Hackers*, *Over Here*, *Auntie Mame* and *East of Eden*.
