The second volume opens with the continuing confrontation between the two Emperors, Alexander I and Napoleon. In the year of 1812, Andrei rejoins the Western Army and Nikolai, too, is at work again; in Moscow, Natasha's continuing illness brings her closer to Pierre: the personal drama continues. And amid the action, Tolstoy discusses the forces that move history, the roles of leaders and the masses in history, as well as chance, genius and the individual. One of the greatest monuments in world literature draws to a close.



Neville Jason trained at RADA, where he was awarded the diction prize by Sir John Gielgud. He has been a member of the BBC Radio Drama Company three times, and may be heard in radio plays, documentaries and arts programmes.
