TO MOST PEOPLE the organ is a solo instrument and as such one of a kind – "a full orchestra". Yet the organ has challenged many composers to combine its rich sound with that of other instruments. One of the most impressive works is Poulenc's *Concerto for organ, strings and timpani* – marked by both "profound suffering and full-blooded ecstasy". Alain's *Suite pour orgue* has a similar intensity – tender, yet powerful. Then there is Langlais' *Deuxième Concerto*: a combination of daring and sublime sounds in an exciting dialogue between organ and strings.



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
