

Amy Woodforde-Finden (1860–1919) wrote a number of 'oriental' song-cycles, one of which, the *Four Indian Love Lyrics* of 1902, contained the 'Kashmiri Song' – beginning 'Pale hands I loved beside the Shalimar' – that became a runaway success in its own day. These ballads have long since fallen from favour, but they contain plenty of honest sentiment, good tunes and splashes of local colour.
