



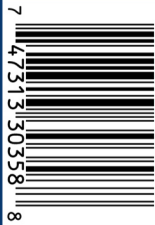

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The great 19th-century violinist Joseph Joachim connects Dvořák's *Violin Concerto* to that of Brahms – Joachim provided invaluable counsel to both composers in these works. Dvořák's Czech spirit is given extra weight through his friend Brahms' influence, with Classical stature meeting eloquent Slavonic vitality to create a splendid masterpiece, performed here by Ruggiero Ricci in this acclaimed recording. The *Piano Concerto* is characteristic of the younger Dvořák. It was long championed by soloist Rudolf Firkušný, whose reputation for cultured musicianship over extrovert virtuosity suited the work perfectly. This classic Vox recording remains one of the finest versions of the *Piano Concerto* available, played by the work's greatest advocate.

The Elite Recordings for Vox by legendary producers Marc Aubort and Joanna Nickrenz are considered by audiophiles to be amongst the finest sounding examples of orchestral recordings
