



Johannes BRAHMS (1833-1897) **Ein deutsches Requiem**

(A German Requiem), Op. 45 Anna Lucia Richter, soprano • Stephan Genz, baritone MDR Leipzig Radio Choir and Symphony Orchestra Marin Alsop

Brahms's A German Requiem, almost certainly triggered by the death of his mother in 1865, is one of his greatest and most popular works, quite unlike any previous Requiem. With texts taken from Luther's translation of the Bible and an emphasis on comforting the living for their loss and on hope of the Resurrection, the work is deeply rooted in the tradition of Bach and Schütz, but is vastly different in character from the Latin Requiem of Catholic tradition with its evocation of the Day of Judgement and prayers for mercy on the souls of the dead.

The success of Marin Alsop as Music Director of the Baltimore Symphony Orchestra was recognized when, in 2009, her tenure was extended to 2015. In 2012 she took up the post of Chief Conductor of the São Paulo Symphony Orchestra, where she steers the orchestra in its artistic and creative programming, recording ventures and its education and outreach activities.





Sergey RACHMANINOV (1873–1943) Symphony No. 1 in D minor, Op. 13 The Isle of the Dead, Op. 29 Detroit Symphony Orchestra • Leonard Slatkin

After the disastrous failure of its première in 1897, Rachmaninov's youthfully exuberant *Symphony No. 1* had to wait until after his death before it was reconstructed from the surviving orchestral parts and performed again, in Moscow in 1945. Since then it has taken its rightful place as one of the great Russian symphonic works of the late nineteenth century. *The Isle of the Dead, Op.* 29 is a vivid and powerful symphonic poem based on a well-known nineteenthcentury painting by the Swiss symbolist artist Arnold Böcklin.

Internationally renowned conductor Leonard Slatkin is currently Music Director of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra and of the Orchestre National de Lyon and Principal Guest Conductor of the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra. He is also the author of a new book entitled Conducting Business.

Ernest BLOCH (1880–1959) Symphony in C sharp minor Poems of the Sea

Composed while Ernest Bloch was studying in Germany and before he moved to America, the richly scored *Symphony in C sharp minor* fits within the romantic tradition of Richard Strauss, Mahler and Bruckner. It expresses Bloch's innermost struggles and emotions, revealing his complex talents through rhapsodic forms, exceptional polyphony and modal tonalities. Inspired by Walt Whitman, the *Poems of the Sea* depict the oceans with striking clarity, including flavours of Irish folk music. Dalia Atlas is a leading expert on Bloch, her acclaimed recordings including America (8.557151) and Four Episodes (8.570259), "a disc not to be missed" (Penguin Guide).

Dalia Atlas won seven prizes in prestigious international conducting competitions, the first woman to do so, and was immediately invited to conduct major orchestras. She has undertaken extensive research into the music of Ernest Bloch to reveal and revive his neglected compositions. She is President of the Ernest Bloch Society in Israel and Vice President of the Ernest Bloch International Society in London.



Leading American composer John Corigliano had reservations about writing a percussion concerto, but the challenge fascinated him. The result is Conjurer, a concerto for percussion like no other, in which 'wood, metal and skin' are utilised in such a way that the soloist, Dame Evelyn Glennie - the world's greatest percussion virtuoso - 'conjures' the musical material from these three choirs, and the orchestra then shares and develops the themes. Vocalise employs electronics in a way that serves to heighten the expressive beauty of the writing, gradually leading the listener from a purely acoustic experience to one that becomes suffused by amplification and electronics.

Awarded Dame Commander of the British Empire in 2007, Evelyn Glennie is the first person in musical history successfully to create and sustain a full-time career as a solo percussionist. She is the leading commissioner of around 170 new works for solo percussion from many of the world's most eminent composers.

David Alan Miller has established a reputation as one of the leading American conductors of his generation. As Music Director of the Albany Symphony, a position he has held since 1992, David Alan Miller has proven himself a creative and compelling orchestra builder.



While Copland's hugely successful celebration of the American West, Rodeo, has become an American classic, Dance Panels is barely known despite working beautifully as a concert work. Based on popular Mexican melodies, the glittering, even exotic El Salón Mexico is one of Copland's most frequently performed works. Of his rhythmically complex Danzón Cubano, inspired by a visit to a dance hall in Cuba, in which there were two orchestras playing at both ends, the composer himself wrote: "I did not attempt to reproduce an authentic Cuban sound but felt free to add my own touches of displaced accents and unexpected silent beats." GRAMMY® Award-winning conductor Leonard Slatkin's recording of Copland's Lincoln Portrait (Naxos CD 8.559373-74) received "the kind of performance that brought tears to my eyes" (Audiophile Audition).



Leonard Slatkin is a standard bearer for top quality performances of American music, with his Abraham Lincoln Portraits (8.559373-74) described as an "essential purchase" by MusicWeb International.



John Knowles Paine was one of the 'Boston Six', a group of important American composers active in the last quarter of the nineteenth century. His German training equipped him with considerable formal skill and he soon rose to become a pioneer of the symphonic tradition in America. Paine's *Symphony No.* 1 received a tremendous reception at its première on account of its attractive themes, skilful orchestration and accomplished design. The Overture As You Like It is notable for its graceful and tuneful themes, whereas Shakespeare's Tempest is a more adventurous and powerful Lisztian tone poem.

JoAnn Falletta serves as Music Director of the Buffalo Philharmonic and Virginia Symphony in the United States and Principal Conductor of the Ulster Orchestra in Northern Ireland.

Sir Peter Maxwell Davies' Strathclyde Concertos are amongst his most imposing contributions to the genre. The solo pairing of his Concerto No. 5 was inspired by Mozart's Sinfonia Concertante for violin and viola, the soloists appearing in dialogue over intricate harmonies and dense string textures. Illuminated by Peter Bruegel's painting Children's Games, the distinctively scored Concerto No. 6 has an uninhibited lightness and transparency. Strathclyde Concerto No. 2 can be heard on

Muzio Clementi's four surviving mature symphonies were never published in his lifetime and were rescued from neglect through painstaking reconstruction. His sophisticated use of counterpoint can be heard in his treatment of the tune God Save the King in the Third Symphony. Classical poise, drama and eloquence of expression in both works can be traced to the influence of Haydn and Mozart. Clementi's Symphonies Nos. 1 and 2 can be heard on Naxos 8.573071.



In 2002 Francesco La Vecchia was appointed Artistic Director and Resident Conductor of the Orchestra Sinfonica di Roma. Under his leadership the orchestra has rapidly achieved success in Europe and in highly successful tours to St Petersburg, Madrid, Belgrade, Brussels, Rio de Janeiro, London, Athens, Berlin, Beijing and Vienna.



Attracted by a delightful fusion of early music sonorities with modern expressiveness, the three composers in this amazingly rich and varied programme build on the magnificent harpsichord concerto legacy of J. S. Bach. John Rutter's beautiful Suite Antique is full of rich and haunting themes, with a significant solo flute part and a jazzy Waltz which is as much Brubeck as Bach. Philip Glass delivers an exciting experience of virtuoso instrumental blending and solo expressiveness, and with typical wit and elegance. Jean Françaix's Concerto is terrific fun throughout.



Appearing here in his Naxos debut, Christopher D. Lewis is a young and rising star who is particularly known for his work in contemporary harpsichord repertoire. Kevin Mallon is an established Naxos artist and renowned for his excellent recordings of early Classical and Baroque repertoire. Mallon's expertise with both chamber forces and the harpsichord suits this more contemporary programme perfectly.

Verklärte Nacht, Op. 4¹ • String Quartet No. 1, Op. 7²

There are a number of points of similarity between Schoenberg's String Quartet No. 1, Op. 7 and Verklärte Nacht, Op. 4, both technical and structural. They were also important works in the composer's life, Verklärte Nacht being - in his own estimation - the first tone poem ever written for chamber ensemble. Both works provoked scandals but both also pointed the way decisively toward future development, not least the quartet, which was a pivotal composition in Schoenberg's career and one that enshrines an intriguing 'private programme'.

Five years after the publication of his first book of sonatas, Jean-Marie Leclair, the

great exponent of the emerging French violin school, released his second book.

He had continued to be influenced by the lyricism and virtuosity of Italian models

but, concerned that the technical demands of his writing might prove excessive, ensured that a handful could be played either on the flute or the violin. Yet he continued to make considerable advances and the level of melodic invention and expressive intensity remained untouched, the result of a fusion of Italianate fire and French elegance. Together with Naxos 8.572866 this is the first complete



Saint-Saëns's early unfinished *Violin Sonata* is testimony to his remarkable precocity as a child. His music's universal appeal is demonstrated in adaptations of his Bach influenced *Suite, Op. 16*, the gracious *Romance, Op. 48* and one of his most famous pieces *Le cygne* (The Swan). The Second Violin Sonata follows classical forms, while the *Méditation* is notable for an affecting melody that builds beautifully to an intimate conclusion. Volume 1 can be heard on Naxos 8.572750. Acclaim for Fanny Clamagirand's playing includes her "brilliant advocacy" of Saint-Saëns's three *Violin Concertos.* (*Strings Magazine* on 8.572037)

Krzysztof MEYER (b. 1943)

Standing at the heart of award-winning Polish composer Krzysztof Meyer's output are his symphonies and string quartets. The first four quartets chart his development over an important decade, from the 1963 First Quartet, Op. 8 to the strikingly powerful Fourth of 1974. Whether structured in a single span as in the Second with its hints of Bartók - or more formally devised in three movements, Meyer's work is at the forefront of contemporary European quartet writing, showing some allegiance to, but differences from, the quartets of his compatriots Penderecki and Lutosławski. This is the fourth and final volume of the complete Quartets.




Since its foundation in 1998 the Wieniawski String Quartet has established itself as one of the leading chamber music ensembles in Poland. The quartet's repertoire ranges from the classical to the contemporary.

Anton Urspruch was Franz Liszt's favourite pupil and saw himself as a 'progressive modernist'. His music, whilst influenced by his teacher, and by Wagner, diverged from the paths taken by contemporaries such as Reger and Richard Strauss. His masterpiece, the comic opera Das Unmöglichste von Allem, is constructed on a symphonic scale with a series of amusing plot lines powered by tuneful and inventive writing. Although the opera was well received early on by both critics and musicians, after Urspruch's death it fell into oblivion until triumphantly revived by the forces on this live recording, the first performance of the original, uncut version of the opera.



Israel Yinon stepped in for Werner Andreas Albert on this production at short notice. He is the opera conductor at the Schwetzinger Festivals, and a guest conductor with the BBC Symphony Orchestra, the Royal Philharmonic, London, and the Deutsches Symphonie Orchester Berlin.

Carlo Gesualdo, Prince of Venosa, became famous for two reasons: the bloody double murder of his first wife and her lover, and his passionate and erotic view of profane love. The Books of *Madrigals* chart the strong changes in his style, and contain some of the most inspired and anguished vocal works in the entire madrigal repertoire, on the themes of love, rejection, death, suffering, joy and sorrow. Brimming with often astonishing and sometimes unpredictable melodic and tonal contrasts to express the agonies and ecstacies of love, Gesualdo's Madrigals show him to have been one of the most inventive and eccentric musical minds of his age.

'If I could have just one set of these madrigals, I have no doubt that I would want to hear the songs spun out as broadly as they are done here. Chromaticism cannot be rushed, and the mannerist style of the turn of the 17th century, which reached its peak in Gesualdo, can absorb every bit of the attention Longhini provides'. J.F. 

Franz Liszt's three pieces inspired by the sonnets of Petrarch were written in Italy after his elopement with Marie d'Agoult. They describe the dawning and power of love, the beauty of the poet's mistress, and the pain which love brings. Further Italian themes are explored in the virtuoso Venezia e Napoli, while the charming Klavierstück No. 2 comes from the period after the couple's bitter parting. The stormy Toccata is from Liszt's old age, and the formidable Grand Galop chromatique was one of his favorite crowd-pleasing encores.



Appearing for the first time on Companion Titles Naxos, Jue Wang has won First Prize and Gold Medal at the 16th Santander Paloma O'Shea International Piano Competition and has made successful débuts at prestigious venues such as New York's Carnegie Hall and London's Wigmore Hall.

Although the Revolutionary year of 1848 saw no lessening in the prolific output of Johann Strauss the Elder, who remained loyal to the monarchy, his music reflected the unsettled times. Originally called Black-Red-Gold (the colours of the united Germany), National Colours was the title given to the work by Strauss' publisher to avoid the possible charge of high treason from the old order. Strauss continued to produce celebratory quadrilles for the Emperor and his family. For his visit to London in April 1849 he wrote music for Queen Victoria that was performed in glittering concerts that were the highlights of the season.





The variety of her playing, its finely-shaded gradations and brilliant but never mechanical figurations, revealed her as already a remarkable artist. Not for many years has a Hallé (Manchester) audience heard such perfectly balanced Mozart playing... No words can describe the wondrous finale, with its mixture of gaiety and anguish.
