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Although written before Rachmaninov reached the age of 21, the two mournfully expressive Piano Trios are wholly characteristic works. With their challenging piano parts and radiant melodies they clearly show the direction Rachmaninov would take as a mature composer. Cast in a single, sonata-form movement, the first Trio elegiaque seems not to have been inspired by any particular melancholy event. Headed 'A la mémoire d'un grand artiste' (In Memory of a Great Artist), the second *Trio* was written in response to news of the death of Tchaikovsky in 1893.
