This fourth volume of the Naxos Robert Craft Schoenberg Collection features Schoenberg's largest and greatest orchestral work. Variations, Op. 31 is a sequence of short and clearly delineated pieces. Their succession follows the tradition of a fast, fullorchestra piece succeeded by a slower one for few instruments, each with a contrasting character, rhythm, and sonority. The highly inventive Serenade for septet and bass - it also includes a mandolin and guitar - is an exuberant, melodious work which makes frequent use of Classical models.
